A crown of people who poured out to participate in the celebrations for the beatification of Father Giuseppe Ambrosoli demonstrating gratitude, love and a vivid sense of belonging to this unique and special place which has continued with unspeakable tenacity, for more than sixty years, to designing a different tomorrow for thousands of the most fragile people on the planet.

Father Giuseppe's gift is truly an extraordinary adventure that fills our lives with meaning. An adventure that the Ambrosoli Foundation has been living for 25 years alongside the hospital and the obstetrics school.

In the last months, in Kalongo on behalf of the Foundation, technicians, resident doctors and volunteers have been alternating in a coming and going capable of giving a decisive and clear sign of continuity and trust to the hospital, the obstetrics school and the local community, increasingly poor and exhausted after the Covid years.

Being there is fundamental. It is important to understand needs, grasp requests, expectations and expectations, to guide but, above all, be guided towards solutions that arise from within the community, not imported from here, cut to our measure.

Father Giuseppe had understood it and lived it day after day: we need to be humble and silent so that we will be able to understand who is most in need and make each of our interventions an opportunity for sustainable and lasting growth.

For this reason, first of all, sharing knowledge, cultivating skills and abilities, and collaborating are necessary. The results achieved last year together with all of you are a concrete example of this. We could not have done it alone.

Sometimes our appeals and our requests for help seem inappropriate to us, almost presumptuous in the face of the immense human tragedies we are witnessing in this part of the world. Helpless and anxious.

A MAN WHO HAS MADE HIMSELF AFRICA

Father Giuseppe was not simply a person who gave Africa his medical knowledge, he was above all **a man who travelled his spiritual path in Africa, to the point of becoming Africa.** On November 20, 2022, this reality received the consecration.

Summarizing in a few lines the emotions experienced on the occasion of the beatification ceremony is quite difficult for me since I felt touched by so many sensations scattered between the past, present and future.

Already in the time spent in Kalongo, in the 80s, the feelings of esteem, affection and gratitude towards Father Ambrosoli were a widespread and shared experience not only among those who worked alongside him but above all among **ordinary, poor and simple people with whom he had a privileged relationship.** The past has surfaced several times, with many small episodes of daily life lived together with him, but also with names and faces never erased from the memory of fraternal friends with some of whom we anxiously waited to be able to meet again on that very day to enjoy the Kalongo of today, with a missionary community even more deeply rooted in this place and with the legacy of the father: the hospital, alive and vital, and the midwifery school, still alive and still an engine of formation, thanks to his ultimate sacrifice.



When my mind then looked to the future, I saw a community in which every family could adequately feed their children, could adequately cure them, so as not to see them die again from so many curable diseases, and could send them to school to prepare them for life, because, even in Africa, we are in the third millennium. Seen from Kalongo these things still seem like a utopia. But looking back at the present, at the progress that Ugandan society has made in recent decades, and at the role that hospitals and schools continue to play, tells us that **all of this is possible. We simply need to keep moving forward, with the awareness that the road that has been traced before us is the right one.**





The rite of beatification of Father Giuseppe Ambrosoli took place in Kalongo on Sunday 20 November 2022, presided over by the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Monsignor Luigi Bianco, delegate of Pope Francis.

An extraordinary moment for everyone, especially for the community of Kalongo. The celebration was attended by about 20,000 pilgrims, who arrived from all over the country on the previous Friday, awaiting the day of celebrations with songs, dances and processions. Even the President of the Ugandan Republic Yoweri Museveni wanted to be present.

We share some excerpts from the homily of Monsignor Luigi Bianco:

"The new Blessed offers a great example of a person who did not look to his own interests, but his life was dedicated entirely and tirelessly to healing the wounds of the bodies and souls of the needy as a priest and doctor. The Apostolic Letter of Pope Francis presents him as a good Samaritan.

He realized in his life what he proclaimed with his lips: "God is love and I am his servant for people who suffer". For Father Ambrosoli there were two altars in Kalongo: the altar of the Eucharist and the operating table, just as there are his two hands that hold the Host and assist a sick person in need of care with the same reverence and respect. With the proverbial smile on his lips, he was always serene in his attitude and full of Christian hope, even in trials.

Kalongo Hospital and Midwifery School were his life and are his monument and legacy. This legacy must continue and grow even with everyone's collaboration".

"YOU ARE NOT ALONE"

Inclusive health for the prevention and treatment of visual, motor and mental disabilities.

The context in which the project operates

In Uganda, 18.7% of the population has a psychosocial, intellectual or motor disability.

Across the country, only 2% of visually impaired children use glasses and only 9% of children who need walking aids and equipment have access to such devices.

The main causes of disability during the early years of childhood are linked to endemic diseases, lack of vaccination against potentially disabling diseases and the absence of rehabilitation services.

The combination of the lack of eye, psychiatric and rehabilitation services and the scarcity of economic means available to families in the Agago district is further aggravated by the very strong stigma surrounding people with disabilities, who are perceived as a curse, potentially contagious and therefore to be removed.

Many men abandon their wives when a disabled child is born, mothers often find themselves isolated from the rest of the family and the practice of abandoning or letting disabled children die is unfortunately common because they are seen as an additional burden for the poorest families.

This is why it becomes urgent and necessary to create spaces where people with disabilities and their families can find adequate care, attention and support. But not only that, it is essential to intervene to raise awareness among the local population, reduce prejudices and promote people's dignity.

The goals to be achieved

The project aims to reduce infant mortality of children under 5 by improving prevention and treatment prospects through the creation of a health service that is more inclusive and attentive to the needs of people with disabilities, who in the district of Agago represent 22.4 % of the population.

The objective will be pursued by expanding and strengthening the services aimed at early diagnosis, prevention and treatment of disabilities at the Kalongo hospital. But not only that, an equally important role will be played by awareness-raising activities carried out to accompany the local community towards greater awareness and a change of perspective and attitude towards the most defenceless people.

II The project involves the construction of:

- **a first-level eye clinic**
- **a rehabilitation and neuro-rehabilitation centre**
- **a sub-intensive therapy**
- **a mental health clinic with specialized psychiatric staff**
- **a counselling desk dedicated to mothers and families of children with disabilities**



ON THE GO THE THREE-YEAR PROJECT FINANCED BY AICS (ITALIAN AGENCY FOR DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION) AND CARRIED OUT IN PARTNERSHIP WITH CBM

To carry out these interventions, the Ambrosoli Foundation and the Kalongo hospital will be supported by CBM, an organization with solid experience in projects for the prevention and treatment of visual impairments, and project partners.

The eye surgery services will be provided by the local partner St. Joseph hospital in Kitgum which will also support the specialists of the Kalongo hospital in setting up the eye clinic.

The prevention and treatment of motor and neuromotor disabilities will be guaranteed thanks to the partnership with the CoRSU specialist rehabilitation hospital in Entebbe. Training is envisaged for the personnel of the surgical, orthopedic and rehabilitation services of Kalongo, which will make it possible to expand the type of surgery and the quality of services for trauma, road accidents and other conditions and pathologies that can cause disability.

The first goals achieved

During the first months of the project, two important structural interventions were carried out: the new eye clinic and the new motor rehabilitation centre. The works inside the eye clinic have been completed and the identification of the medical equipment and devices that will have to be purchased to make it operational is in progress. We also proceeded to recruit qualified medical personnel who can manage the optimal functioning of the clinic.

Work is still ongoing in the rehabilitation centre, to make it functional to the needs of the rehabilitation staff, equipping it with all the necessary equipment and furnishings. The space and the bathrooms will be easily usable by people with disabilities because they will be adapted to the national guidelines for the accessibility of people with disabilities.

All the interventions carried out will also continue at the end of the three-year project because the hospital will integrate the new clinics within its ordinary activity, guaranteeing their continuation in the long term with permanent benefits for the local population.
